

### **Parenting conduct orders:**

1. Each parent shall encourage a positive relationship between the children and the other parent.
2. Each parent shall encourage and allow the child(ren) to express their love for the other parent.
3. Each parent shall ensure that the child(ren) comply with court orders.
4. Both parents are prohibited from making or allowing others to make negative verbal comments about the other parent, the other parent's past or present relationships or family within hearing distance of the child(ren).
5. Both parents are prohibited from posting anything negative about the other parent, the other parent's past or present relationships or family on social media.
6. Both parents are prohibited from questioning the child(ren) regarding the activities of the other parent.
7. Both parents are prohibited from having the other parent served with any legal documents in the child(ren)'s presence.
8. Other than to simply advise of upcoming scheduling that directly involves the children, both parents are prohibited from discussing with the child(ren) or allowing discussion by others in the presence of the child(ren), any issues relating to the case or any related case.
9. Both parents are prohibited from providing, showing or reading to the child(ren), or allowing any other person to do so, any documents relating to this case or any related case, including but not limited to pleadings, declarations, letters, photographs, video recordings, mediation reports and/or custody evaluations.
10. Both parents shall be civil to each other and protect the child(ren) from their conflict during exchanges, at the child(ren)'s school or any other time or location where both parents are present with the child(ren).
11. Both parents shall think critically about their own choices and behaviors to gain introspection and understanding about how they each contribute to co-parenting dynamics, and how they each could modify their own behavior to reduce conflict to benefit their child(ren). The parties shall be prepared to discuss compliance with this order at any future Family Court Services mediation or court hearing related to parenting issues.
